

The History of Hacking



1960

Hacking first conducted at MIT; this **early form of hacking** was simply a way to improve tech system operations.



1981

Captain Zap, is the **first hacker to be convicted** as a criminal after he breaks into AT&T's computer systems.



1990

The UK government passes the **Computer Misuse Act**, making this the first time that unauthorized access to computer systems is criminalized in the UK.



1991

The **World Wide Web** is created.



1994

Citibank's wire transfer service is hacked by **Russian hackers**.



2001

Microsoft is hit by first DoS attack. **Denial of Service (DoS) hacks** will become one of the most common types of hacking incidents.



2003

Hackivist Group Anonymous is formed.



2004

Mark Zuckerberg hacks into Harvard University newspaper reporter's email accounts to aid in **establishing TheFacebook.com**.



2013

According to Sophos Labs, there are an estimated **30,000 websites hacked** every single day.



2015

In one of the **most catastrophic individual hacks** in history, 145,000,000 accounts are stolen from eBay's database.



2020

It is estimated that **global Cyber Security spending** will reach or exceed \$170 billion.
